I hereby transfer cash or other property to establish the **Kewpie.Net Scholarship Fund** ("Fund") with the **Community Foundation of Central Missouri** ("Community Foundation").

The Community Foundation of Central Missouri is authorized to accept charitable contributions to the Fund subject to the terms set forth herein.

I intend that the income and principal from the Fund provide annual scholarships for the purpose stated below.

1. Purpose

The purpose of the Fund shall be to provide scholarships to graduating students from the David H. Hickman High School, Columbia, MO, to further their education at a post-secondary educational institution.

2. Student Eligibility

The students eligible for assistance shall be graduating seniors from Hickman High School who exemplify service to their school and/or community. The recipients will be students who exemplify the Kewpie spirit and who have exhibited a desire to work with their respective class to preserve the Kewpie spirit after graduation. While financial need should be considered, the main criterion for this scholarship is outstanding service. Additional characteristics may be considered in the discretion of the Community Foundation.

3. Type and Amount of Aid

The type and amount of aid shall be at the discretion of the Board of Directors of the Community Foundation and may include, but is not necessarily limited to at least two scholarships awarded annually to graduating seniors from Hickman High School, or if the Fund's income and principal are deemed sufficient by the Community Foundation to

cover an additional scholarship, then an additional amount may be awarded to an additional graduating senior from Hickman High School. If for any reason Hickman High School ceases to exist, then I intend for the annual scholarship to be awarded to a graduate of another Columbia, Missouri, high school then serving the area now served by Hickman High School. Should such occur, the recipient will reflect the eligibility characteristics stated above, with "Kewpie spirit" defined as community service.

4. Selection of Scholarship Recipient

All scholarship applications shall be submitted directly to the Community Foundation. The Community Foundation, through its duly authorized committees and in consultation with administrators from Hickman High School, shall review all eligible scholarship applications and make the selection(s) independently.

I hereby acknowledge receipt of the Administrative Fee Schedule attached and accept the terms of said schedule. I further understand the fee schedule is subject to modification and may be increased or decreased at the sole discretion of the Community Foundation's Board of Directors. I agree to be bound by the most current schedule of fees published by the Community Foundation.

I have received copies and accept the terms of the Procedures For The Establishment And Operation Of Funds and Article XVII of the Bylaws of the Community Foundation. I also understand that the Community Foundation, through its duly authorized committees, reserves the right to make the final decision regarding distributions from the Fund.

In the event that the Board of Directors of the Community Foundation determines that continued distributions for the above specified scholarship purpose have become unnecessary, obsolete, incapable of fulfillment, impractical or inconsistent with the community's charitable needs, the Community Foundation may change the purpose of the Fund or shall use the principal and income from the Fund for its general and charitable purposes as set forth in the Bylaws.

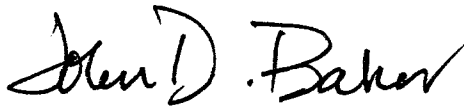

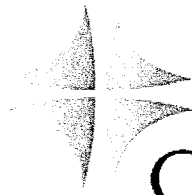

ANNUAL ADMINISTRATIVE FEES ON THE MARKET VALUE OF FUND ASSETS

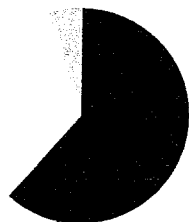
1.00% on the first \$500,000
0.60% on the next \$500,000
0.30% on the next \$2 million
0.10% on the next \$4 million

Funds with assets in excess of \$7 million will be charged a flat fee of 0.25% on the total assets. The minimum fee is \$250 per year. The fees stated above are the annual fees; fees are charged to the fund monthly based on the average fair market value of assets. For newly established funds, the minimum annual fee is prorated over the remainder of the year.

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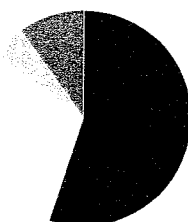

MEMO: To HHS Class of '63

RE: Charley Blackmore's Class of '63 Scholarship

DATE: October 28, 2008

As you may know, at the reunion in early October, we decided to create a class of '63 Scholarship which we named the Charley Blackmore's Class of '63 Scholarship in honor of all the work Charley has done for all of us. The idea came up on the tour we were given by Greg Grupe, an assistant principal at Hickman. He mentioned a scholarship named for a teacher from our day that requires a 3.0 or higher GPA. I asked if we could name it for Charley and require less than a 3.0. Mr. Grupe promptly pulled out a twenty and gave it to me, saying he wanted to make the first contribution.

Charley and I and some others then talked to Mr. Grupe privately, giving back his twenty, and receiving his suggestion that we make "service" the main requirement of a scholarship. The school now has a "hall of fame" where male and female students are picked each year for scholastic accomplishment, for athletic accomplishment, for fine arts, and for service. He pointed out there is no scholarship presently that recognizes service.

As I thought about it that day, I realized that would be perfect for a scholarship with Charley's name on it, so I suggested setting one up that night at the party at the Country Club. Everybody seemed to like the idea and some pledged some money toward it. You know who you are.

With the idea in place, David Griggs, David Curtis, Charley and I met on the 21st to hammer out criteria which Charley is making available on the web site. We went to the school to get some guidance on format. At that meeting, Greg Grupe dropped in, and his twenty is again the first contribution to the fund. I think that demonstrates how valuable Charley is to the whole Hickman community and that we do get instant credibility by putting his name on the scholarship.

Our goal is to get enough funds together by the end of this school year to fund at least two \$500.00 scholarships for a boy and a girl. We would like to see the fund grow over the years so that we can do better than that. Stay tuned for information on leaving something to the fund in your will, or other kinds of giving that we haven't thought of yet. Also, think of the person in whose memory or honor you might like to make a contribution. Mine is in memory of Leo Behrens.

Make your check payable to Hickman High School so it will be tax deductible. In the note portion or lower left corner of the check notate "CBC '63 Scholarship" and the name of the individual, if you choose to make your donation as a memorial. Send it to Charley in Columbia to make sure the money gets where it is supposed to and to make sure Charley has the information on who is giving and in whose honor a gift is being made so that he can put that information on the web page. He assures us he has no interest in knowing the size of the donation, other than to keep a running total and accurate information on the webpage.

Please look back on the good times you had at Hickman, all of you had at least a few, and remember how unique and special it is just to be a Kewpie, then do what you can for this scholarship fund so that we can be remembered as something other than the last beanie wearers.

Thank you for your attention to this. As Charley would say, "With Kewpish Regards"
