4. Students are selected by academic departments for department specific awards. *(D)*

COMMUNITY AWARDS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Bob Alderson Boone Electric Community Trust Scholarship (G) is awarded to a senior who exemplifies outstanding scholarship, community service, and leadership - *Presented by Khesha Duncan*

Alpha Delta Kappa (O) is an international honorary society for women's education and awards this scholarship annually to a high school student with high scholarship and citizenship ratings who plans to attend a college or university and pursue a career in education - *Presented by Marilyn Skipper*

Alpha Kappa Alpha Doris H. Lewis (O) this scholarship is awarded to a high achieving student who is a good citizen, actively engaged in co-curricular opportunities, and has been accepted into a 4-year college/university - *Presented by Dr. Botswana Blackburn*

American Civil Liberties Award (D) recognizes and honors students who have made significant contributions to protecting the civil liberties granted to us in the United State Constitution and also protecting human rights asserted in the Declaration of Human Rights of the United Nations. The students recognized should have been actively involved in civil rights and human rights concerning local and international issues - *Presented by George Frissell*

American Legion Auxiliary/Ella Glascock/Minnie Brown Memorial Scholarship (O) is given to a Missouri resident, descendant of a veteran, and must be planning to attend an accredited college or university as a full time student - *Presented by Eric Johnson*

Joe M. Barnes Cup (D) is awarded to the outstanding male athlete at Hickman High School who displays leadership, sportsmanship, and citizenship - *Presented by Eric Johnson*

Cassandra Black Memorial Scholarship (O) is presented in memory of Cassi Black, a 2000 graduate of Hickman High School. She was an architectural and fine arts design major at KU at the time of her death. She could best be described as a humanitarian who valued diversity, perseverance and determination, tolerance, compassion, fair and open-mindedness, altruism, and what she called "that everyday beauty." This scholarship seeks to support others who share the passion that Cassi had for life through these beliefs. - Presented by *Bobbie Pauley*

Charley Blackmore's Class of '63 Scholarship
Charley Blackmore Scholarship/Class of 1963 (F) is given to two graduating seniors who "understand what it is to be a Kewpie," have demonstrated this understanding through outstanding school and community service and are planning to continue their education at a technical school, community college, or a four-year college - Presented by *Charley Blackmore*

Boone County 4-H Scholarships (O) are given to graduating seniors, members of 4-H who demonstrate leadership, community service, citizenship, and complete a 4-H project - Presented by *Eric Johnson*

Boone County Chapter of Mizzou Alumni Association Scholarship (O) is given to an outstanding graduating senior who has been active in extracurricular activities, shows academic progress, and has demonstrated outstanding citizenship - Presented by *Eric Johnson*

Chamber of Commerce/Russell V. Thompson Scholarship (O) is given to an outstanding senior who has shown academic excellence and leadership in school and community activities, and who plans to attend a college or university in Columbia - Presented by *Eric Johnson*

Class of 1930 Scholarship (F) is given to a senior who has been an active participant in extracurricular activities and has demonstrated outstanding citizenship - Presented by *Eric Johnson*

Class of 1936 Scholarship (F) is given to a senior who has been an active participant in extracurricular activities and has that "Kewpie Spirit" - Presented by *Eric Johnson*

Class of 1953 Scholarship (F) is given to a senior who is a true Kewpie through service, academics, and leadership - Presented by *Eric Johnson*

Class of 1959 Scholarship (F) is given to a senior who is planning on attending college, values scholarship, hard work, and is an excellent citizen - Presented by *Diana Groshong*

Class of 1960 Scholarship (F) is given to a senior who has been a faithful Kewpie friend and promotes fellowship - Presented by *Eric Johnson*

Class of 1962 Scholarship (F) is given to a senior who is a true Kewpie as shown through their service, academics, and leadership - Presented by *Hickman Representative*

Class of 1965 Scholarships (F) are given in honor of classmates who made the ultimate sacrifice in Vietnam, to two seniors in recognition of their enthusiasm, citizenship, and service contribution to the school and community - Presented by *Eric Johnson*

Class of 1969/Leo Behrens Scholarship (F) is given by the Hickman Music Boosters in memory of a former Columbia Public School music department chair to an outstanding instrumental student who has participated in band or orchestra for at least three years, shows high academic achievement, and provides service to the Hickman Music Department - Presented by *Denis Swope*

Class of 1978/Mark Gregory Winfrey Scholarship (F) is given to a senior who has been active in extra curricular activities at Hickman and finds joy in learning - Presented by *Eric Johnson*

Class of 1992 Scholarship (F) is given to a senior who demonstrates honesty and loyalty in real Kewpie spirit through academics, sports, community service, and citizenship - Presented by *Eric Johnson*

Mabel Wayland Coats Memorial Scholarship (F) is given in honor of Mabel W. Coats, a 1935 Hickman graduate, who received a scholarship to the Orton-Rice Business School. With this scholarship, awarded to a senior who has scholastic achievement in business and computer education classes, she hopes to return the favor she received - Presented by *Eric Johnson*

Cleva Cole Writing Award (D) is given to a student who has submitted the Outstanding Senior Writing Portfolio and recognizes the student who has most exemplified excellence in writing - Presented by *Phil Overeem*

Heather Cole Sparkle of Hope Scholarship (O) is given by her parents in memory of Heather Cole, a 2011 graduate of Hickman, to a senior who plans to major in education and has a desire to be a teacher. Heather was an inspiration to many of her friends and family for her kindness, ability to work hard, and focus on her goal to become a teacher. - Presented by *Sara Buxton, Michelle Farmer, Meghann Momphard*

Columbia African American Memorial Scholarship (O) is given in honor of former Columbia African American high school students from the classes of 1979 and 1980, now deceased. It is awarded to assist talented young African American students in pursuit of higher education and to help shape students into future leaders - Presented by *James T. Turner*

Columbia Art League/Carolyn McLaughlin Birkes Scholarship (O) is given to a senior whose portfolio is judged as outstanding by the Columbia Art League and who plan to major or minor in Art - Presented by *Karen Shortt-Stout*

Columbia Downtown Rotary Club Scholarship (F) is given to a graduating senior who demonstrates high scholarship and a desire to attend a college or university. This student also exemplifies the four way test of rotary; is it truth, is it fair, will it build good will and better friendship, will it be beneficial to all concerned - Presented by *Cindy Mustard*

Columbia Missouri National Education Association Scholarship (O) is given to a student with a GPA of 2.5 or higher and a significant record of volunteer experience who is planning to continue their education in college or a trade or technical school - Presented by *Cassidy Urie*

Columbia Missouri State Teachers Association Scholarship (O) is given to a senior on the basis of academic record, activities, interest in education as a career goal, and is recommended by faculty/community leaders - Presented by *Jill Kiley*

Columbia Police Scholarship Fund (O) is presented to children of Columbia Police Department personnel and are based on citizenship and the desire to pursue further education - Presented by *Sean Dutton*

Columbia Youth Basketball Association (O) is given to a male and female who played for Columbia Youth Basketball Association based on an essay about what playing the CYBA program meant to them and how it has helped in their future endeavors - Presented by *Carie Copeland*

Phil Driskill Social Studies Scholarship (D) is presented to the senior student that shows a love of the social sciences including history, sociology, and psychology. The recipient is also a member of one of the social studies extra-curricular activities and has excellent service and citizenship - *Presented by Eric Johnson*

Bruce Gray Memorial Track Awards (D) are given each year to one male and one female track and field team member who have demonstrated sportsmanship and leadership - *Presented by Stewart Johnson*

Sylvia Mae Hansen Scholarship (F) is presented to a senior who plans to attend college or vocational school, displays good citizenship, and has participated in school activities - *Presented by Pastor Paul Moessner*

James E. Hickem, III Memorial Art Scholarship (O) is given, in memory of James Hickem, to a senior who has been known as an artist throughout his/her high school career and through submitted works of art and essay has excelled and clearly conveyed what the ability to create art has meant to them - *Presented by Cray Logan*

Hickman Alumni Award (D) is given to the most outstanding female athlete at Hickman High School who displays outstanding leadership, sportsmanship, and citizenship - *Presented by Eric Johnson*

Hickman Athletic Booster Club Scholarships (O) is awarded to athletes who have participated on a high school athletic team, cheerleading, or dance squad, exhibit good citizenship and sportsmanship, have at least "B" average, and have been accepted to an accredited college or university. Hickman Girls' Basketball Award (D) is awarded to the outstanding senior girl basketball player - *Presented by Tonya Mirts*

Hickman H.O.P.E. Club Scholarships (O) is awarded to the outstanding senior club member who demonstrates strong leadership at school events and in the community. This senior displays outstanding character and citizenship education peers on the dangers of drug and alcohol use. Don Byers Service Award (F) is given to the young man of outstanding citizenship making the greatest contribution in service to Hickman High School - *Presented by Eric Johnson*

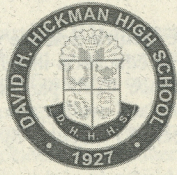

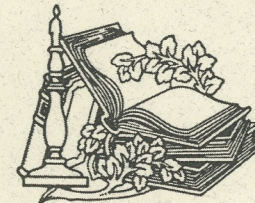
