Twenty members of that great 1943 class came from across the country to renew friendships and ties in Columbia on June 7 and 8. Due to effects of World War II, the exact number of graduates is nebulous, but there are some 210-215 who could be counted legitimately in the '43 class.

Charles Willard, Fort Lauderdale, FL received the award for coming the farthest, although Virgina Douglass Hopper, from Garden Grove, CA might contest that. Anna Dean Ballew Teague journeyed from Mooresville, NC, Marjorie Jones Geist came from Worthington, OH, Elizabeth Itschner Elliot came from Godfrey, IL, John Loser came from Overland Park KS and O. D. Hawkins came from West Des Moines, IA.

From Columbia were: Bill and Helen Fenton Graves, Freda Griffin Humphreys, O. V. Wheeler, Ed Gibbs, Hilda Bozarth Moore, Violet Bennett Canole, Gene Armstrong and Robert Kemper.

Four Missourians came from points outside Columbia; David Berbert from Springfield, Hazel Tharpe Willett from Linn, Reba McCann Barnhart from West Plains and Joe Forsee all the way from Ashland (14 miles).


He has renewed friendship with a lady that he had not seen for 67 years.




