<u>Straw Bale Gardening</u>

Members were treated to a wonderful presentation on "Straw Bale Gardening" by Charles Paxton at our March CGC meeting. The bale preparation fertilizer amounts are as follows for those that might want to try this type of gardening. <u>It is important to use the</u> <u>exact amount listed below</u>.

Day 1: 4 oz. Nitrogen and water in
Day 2: water thoroughly
Day 3: 4 oz. Nitrogen and water in
Day 4. Water thoroughly
Day 5. 4 oz Nitrogen and water in
Day 6. Water thoroughly
Day 7, 8, 9 - 2 oz. Nitrogen and water in
each of these days
Day 10 & 11 apply 1 cup 10-10-10 balanced
fertilizer and water thoroughly
Day 12 Plant

Growing Knowledge at the Farm Workshop Series

Jefferson Farm and Garden and the Heart of Missouri Master Gardeners are teaming up to offer a series of gardening workshops. The second Tuesday of each month April thru September 2017 5 to 7 pm. Workshops are ideal for both beginner and advanced gardeners, and include:

April 11: Getting Ready to Garden. Learn how to prepare your soil to create a flourishing and productive garden. Explore considerations for vegetable and ornamental gardens, how to plant, and what to do to properly maintain growing plants.

May 9: Garden Techniques. Learn the basics of planning and constructing raised beds, putting together productive container gardens, and the methods for establishing a no-till garden.

June 13: Companion Planting. Discover which plants can benefit from one another when grown in close proximity. This is a great way to encourage plant growth, deter pests, attract beneficial insects, and improve garden productivity.

July 11: Butterfly Gardening. If you plant it, they will come! Learn what native plants attract butterflies, which host plants are needed by caterpillars, and how to recreate a pollination garden habitat at home.

Aug. 8: Insects in the Garden. Not all bugs are pests! Learn how important it is to recognize beneficial insects in the garden and when to leave them alone to do their important work.

Sept. 12: Putting the Garden to Bed. Give your garden a head-start for next year's growing season. Learn techniques to prepare your garden for winter through composting, planting cover crops, and applying mulch covers to planting beds.
