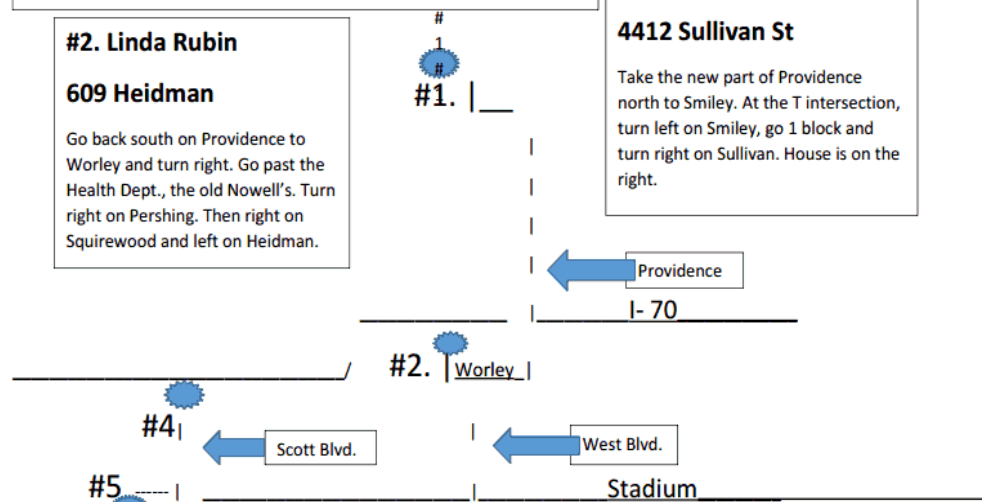
609 Heidman

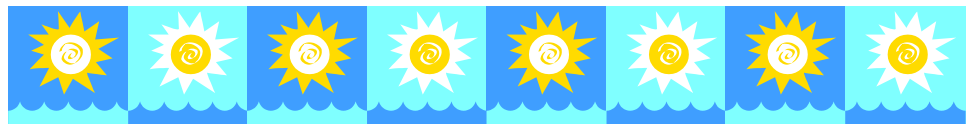
#3. Janet Lasley

Committee Updates:

The committee hopes to have signage installed identifying CGC as designers and donors of the 4 storybook gardens.
