- -Plant tender annuals after frost free date of May 10<sup>th</sup>- remember to acclimate your plants before planting (set them out for a short time in a shady spot for short periods for a couple days before planting in the garden bed)
- -Plant something new this year
- -If you have pine needles dropping make sure to rake them up, they will kill your lawn. Pine needles make great mulch.
- -Divide mums when about 2 inches tall
- Cut and bring in sweet smelling Lily of the Valley blooms.
