#### Need to Water Your Trees in the Winter.

Even in years when drought is not a concern -Winter watering is crucial, especially with evergreen trees!

- Well timed fall and winter watering may allow a tree to survive on less water than a regime of plentiful water applications during the growing season.

-Tree roots continue to grow throughout the winter and need moisture to survive.

-Generally, water one to two times per month October through March on a warm day when the ground is not frozen. Use the same amount of water as during the summer months.
