

GOT MILDEW ON YOUR ROSES?

In a note from Al Lackey, he refers to Alice, who hosts the Saturday Morning Garden show from Longfellow's in JC.: Alice says to add 2 tablespoons baking soda to a gallon of water plus 1 teaspoon liquid soap. If you go to Google and ask for the baking soda recipe for mildew on roses you will get a different formula plus a lot of good information on application, etc. Their recipe calls for 1 tablespoon Baking soda per gallon of water and ½ tsp. liquid soap. They also warn of possible burning of the leaves.

I used Alice's formula last year with good success.
