Winter Garden Survival

*Water outdoor plants when little moisture is falling

*Do not prune back butterfly or other tender shrubs until green growth starts in the spring

*Crape Myrtle trunks can be sprayed with Wilt Pruf to help with winter cold survival

*Annual poppy seeds can be planted in late January or February

*Don't cut ornamental grasses until late March; tops can help protect plant during winter cold



Be very careful! Spring thaw is just around the corner!
