May 11 Minutes

The meeting was called to order by President Linda Lowenberg at 1:10 P.M. Thirty-three members were present. This number includes new members Mary Douglas, Mary Horton, and Marlene Willick who were attending their first meeting with us. President Linda, a retired librarian, presented a power point program on "Going and Growing with Books and Websites for Garden Enthusiasts". The bibliography she had prepared for us included websites and many types of books.

Following the program and refreshments, Inspiration Chair Marie Crenshaw read several items of encouragement for us. Tips on keeping deer from our plants were given by Lucille Wayland and Gayle Frye. Lucille uses one egg to one quart of water well-mixed. Gayle uses Irish Spring soap which has been cut in cubes. This is distributed under the plants. The minutes of the April meeting printed in the newsletter were accepted as printed. Treasurer Karen Blackmore reported a checking balance of \$4,605.45 and a CD balance of \$3,012.61 for total assets of \$7,618.06.

Plant Sale Chair Marie Pasley reported: total sales of \$2698.75; total expenses of \$623.25 for a net profit of \$2075.50. Broken down as follows: plants: \$1669.25; baked goods: \$145.25; children's baskets: \$37.00 and the basket drawing: \$249.00. (Note 12 additional dollars were sold at the meeting bringing the drawing to \$261.00 and the overall profit to \$2087.50.)

COMMITTEE REPORTS

<u>Garden Tour</u> Chair Cindy Deegan asked that we meet to form car pools at Patricia's IGA at 8:00 A.M. on June 8. We plan to leave on the tour at 8:30. <u>Floral arrangements for Columbia Public Library/Wyatt House</u> Chair Lynn Birkby said Karen Blackmore will take flowers to the Library and Leona Litteral will provide a bouquet to Wyatt House in June. <u>Clean Up Columbia</u> Chair Janet Lasley thanked all those who helped on cleaning McKee Park. <u>Conservation/Forestry</u> Chair Gayle Fry passed out a Missouri Department of Conservation sheet on the proper way to mulch a tree. <u>Flower Show</u> Co-Chair Carolyn Doyle reported that home grown annuals and perennials will not be part of the Flower Show this year due to the time of year. Horticulture will include samples from trees, evergreens, shrubs, fruits and vegetables. Terrariums and collections of plants (ex. 5 specimens of African violets) are examples of other classes that will be judged. <u>Ways and Means</u> Co-Chair Marie Pasley said that we hope our tomato growers can continue next year and if possible grow some of the same tomato plants. Also, we need more shade plants next year as people were asking for them. Marie is recommending that next year we continue with the gardening basket drawing and the made ahead baskets. We might want to consider dropping the make and take baskets and the bake sale. Next year no annuals will be purchased at the Versailles Market. If we want to include annuals, we might consider asking local Career Center horticulture students to bring in plants on consignment.

<u>OLD BUSINESS</u>: President Linda announced that our club earned fourth place at the FGCM State Convention "as the club which has excelled in performing best the most objectives. Also, Alice Havard accepted on behalf of the club a volunteer certificate for the work members do at the Bluffs.

<u>NEW BUSINESS</u>: President Linda said she needs someone to volunteer to Chair the Nominating Committee for new officers. Also she asked for ideas of places members would like to visit. Two suggestions were Vintage Hill (Boonville) and Powell Gardens.

<u>ANNOUNCEMENTS:</u> Carol Notbohm brought poppies to give away. New member Marlene Willick won the drawing for the garden basket.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:15 P.M.
