The Columbia Garden Club has proven to be a venerable organization. It should be no surprise that it would have its share of WWII veterans. Ken Sadler and Marie Crenshaw, both over 20 years in the club, took part in the Honor Flights to Washington D.C. Both made the trips to three war memorials and both visited Arlington National Cemetery, the resting place of not only veterans, but presidents as well.

Marie joined the club in 1987 and was elected president her second year. Currently she is the Inspiration Committee chair, a job she has held several years. She has been Treasurer as well. During the war, she was stationed in Denver, CO. in the Army Nurse Corp at Fitzsimmons Army General hospital for fifteen months. She says the trip to D.C. "happened so fast" and "was interesting".

Ken, now 85, and his wife, Jane, have won many prizes in the annual Garden Club flower show, including "Best in Show." It will be a pleasure to look for their beautiful displays in the upcoming December show. They make substantial contributions to the annual plant sale. Ken was "all over" during his Army service from 1943 to 1946 as Lieutenant and platoon leader: Fort Benning, GA and the South Pacific (Philippines). He also oversaw the non-Japanese prison at a fine hotel in Japan after the war ended. He says his October Honor Flight meant "a tremendous amount".
