"HOLIDAY TREATS"

Since this will be a special show with limited plants in bloom, interesting classes are included in the show schedule. For example, you may decide to enter a holiday wreath in the Design division. In Horticulture, Division II, Section E, Container Grown Plants, "must have been in the exhibitor's possession at least for 90 days" and in Section F, you might want to enter a combination planting; either a terrarium, dish garden or a combination planter. These entries "Must have been growing together and in exhibitor's possession for at least six weeks prior to exhibiting."

You should be deciding now what you will enter in the show so that you can have it planned out and planted to meet the requirements of the show schedule.

We should have a beautiful show as it will include holiday entries that may be more "glitzy" than we usually see in a show. What fun! We'll talk more at the September meeting!

Among the flowers in the Parker's yard are cone flowers, dwarf zinnias, dwarf balloon flowers, white hydrangeas, red and white caladium, Indian blanket, autumn joy sedum and various grasses. Jade amended the soil with 12 loads of city compost and lots of topsoil from Calvin Trucking Co. Beds are round and kidney shaped and include stepping stones of tree trunk slices. They have two water features, one of bamboo tubing and the other is a black stone globed fountain. If you have not driven by this lovely yard, it is definitely worth the trip!
