## **ALL-SCHOOL ALUMNI REUNION EVENTS FOR 2014!**

Over the years many alumni have suggested the Louisiana Alumni and Friends Association host a dinner somewhere other than the high school. They've spoken and the Association has listened!

Plans have recently been finalized for the annual all-school reunion during Colorfest weekend. On Saturday, October  $18^{th}$  the present high school/middle school complex will be open for tours from 3-5 p.m. Interested alumni will be able to take a walk "back in time" and see the recent improvements to the campus. (Read elsewhere in this newsletter about enhancements being made this summer to the entrance to the football stadium.)

From 5-6:30 p.m. a social hour / mixer will be open to all alumni and friends at the American Legion hall located at 420 Kelly Lane. This will allow alumni from various classes to visit and see how many from their high school days they recognize years later. A dinner for only those with reservations will begin at 6:30 p.m. at the American Legion. The meal will be catered by the American Legion members and tickets are \$20/person. This ticket will include admission to the dance which starts at 9 p.m. (see below).

After dinner, in lieu of an alumni speaker, the special reunion classes (those with their graduation year ending in 4 or 9) will be recognized. Also, a brief annual business meeting required by our by-laws will be held.

Later that evening at the American Legion hall, there will be live entertainment / a dance featuring the band Country Soul. This will run from 9 p.m. to 1 a.m. A \$5/person cover charge will be required to enter for the dance (unless you attended the dinner earlier as you dinner reservation includes admission to the dance). During all events at the American Legion a cash bar will be available.

By the way, the LHS Bulldogs play a home football game on Friday, October 17<sup>th</sup>. It will be senior recognition night but not homecoming. Kickoff is at 7 p.m. and the Bulldog Boosters host a great concession stand. The Bulldog Store will also be open so you can buy the latest in LHS Bulldog apparel and support the Boosters at the same time. This would be a great place for alums to meet Friday evening to mingle with others and to cheer on their alma mater. You could see first-hand the new entrance to the stadium and make post-game plans.


\$3,000. They have budgeted another \$3,000 for it and the Music Boosters are going to plan fundraising to offset the balance of the projected \$8,000 purchase!

## FOOTBALL STADIUM ENHANCED



A project to upgrade the entrance to Cunningham Field (the football stadium) was begun in late June. It is a joint effort between the Bulldog Boosters and Louisiana R-II School District. It is believed this will show more pride in our facilities while giving those visiting from other communities a much better impression of our school.

The existing ticket booth and chain-link fence will be replaced. The new ticket booth will feature front facing windows (see elevation) while the black, aluminum 6-foot fence will provide a new look for our already excellent facilities. It's anticipated it will be completed in time for the first home football game late in August.

Much of the work is being done by volunteers. Thanks to all who helped with this project.

## HELPING OUR SCHOOL DISTRICT

This spring we approached Dr. Basden, the Louisiana R-II school district superintendent, about the needs of the district. We were looking for a need(s) their budget would not be able to cover but something that was rather important. At an earlier Association planning meeting, it was mentioned how poor the sound system was in the middle school (former high school) gym. The comments from those who attended were "At the school play you couldn't hear any of the performers...It was as if the sound system was turned off... It's a shame after all the hard work the students had put in practicing...".

When this was brought up to Dr. Basden as a possibility, he replied "Yes, I view that as the 'weakest link' in the district's facilities. It is used not only by the school for various events but also for community gatherings such as Veteran's Day observance, etc. It would be a great project for the Alumni Association to assist with." The district asked the music/band director to research costs. He learned a new basic sound system will run about \$8,000. Adding on some lapel microphones and other add-ons deemed necessary, the total cost may approach \$10,000. Dr. Basden indicated it would be great if the Alumni Association could cost-share with the district on it. When the Music Booster president was approached to see if they might be able to participate, they said their funds were very low but they would see what they could do. In June, Dr. Basden shared he had built \$3,000 in the district's initial 2014-15 budget for this project.

At the Association's June 21 planning meeting, it was approved to make a \$3,000 donation to the school district designated for use toward the middle school sound system upgrade. It is hoped Music Boosters' fundraisers, the school district and/or other source of funds will allow this much-needed project to be completed this fall.

It was learned just before press time the Louisiana Rotary Club is donating \$1,000 toward this much-needed project.

### PROPOSED BY-LAW REVISIONS TO BE PRESENTED

At the Association's annual meeting to be held during the All-School Reunion Dinner on October 18th, members will be asked to vote on a few changes to our by-laws. The proposed changes 1) automatically grants membership in the Association to anyone who ever attended Louisiana public schools, as well as any administrators, teachers and support staff who ever served the District; 2) renames the current Article IV from Dues to Financial Support; 3) replaces the sections of Article IV referring to annual and lifetime membership dues with sections regarding a new financial support system.

The specific changes will be posted to our website for viewing 30 days prior to our annual meeting. If you do not have internet access, you may request a copy of the proposed changes by contacting the Association's secretary, Linda Beer, at 573-754-6495 or mail a request for a copy to the Louisiana Alumni & Friends Association, PO Box 404, Louisiana, MO 63353-0404. Copies of the proposed changes will be posted at the American Legion during the social hour and dinner for viewing as well.

#### **GIERKE SCHOLARSHIPS**

In March, alum Brent Gierke (Class of '82) approached the Alumni Association about taking over the administration of the Jacob Adam Gierke (Class of '91) Memorial Scholarship. Though his family has been grateful to the Missouri Press Association for their dedicated support in handling the scholarship, he believes the Alumni Association will be in the best position to manage it moving forward.

He asked the Association this year to select the three 2014 winners who were each awarded \$1,000. They were: Melissa Powers who plans to attend Truman State or Missouri Western State Univ. and study psychology, earn her Master's and become a professor; Zach Reever and Shelby Renner, see article about alumni scholarship winners for their plans.

Brent's request suggested, with some reservations, renaming it the Gierke Family Memorial Scholarship for 2015. This would allow it to also honor his brother, Christian (Class of '90), and dad, Jim (Class of '65), who have passed away since Jacob died in an auto accident in 1989. To prolong the life of the scholarship, Gierke asked the Association to award one \$2,000 scholarship each year beginning in 2015.

In April, the Alumni Association approved Brent's request to serve as administrator of this scholarship going forward.



# LHSYear in Review

#### Greetings!!

I appreciate this forum to keep you abreast of the great things that are happening at LHS. I have been the Principal at the high school for six years now. My mother was in the LHS class of 1958, Martha Sue Zook.





We continue to offer students a wide variety of course selections. Each year we increase offerings in dual credit coursework. Students have the potential to leave LHS with 24 hours of college credit. 2013-14 was our first year as an A+ school. Twelve seniors fulfilled the requirements and took advantage of the free and/or discounted tuition offered to A+ graduates by Missouri community colleges and universities.

Athletically, the Bulldogs had an outstanding year. LHS is fortunate to have motivated student athletes and a great group of dedicated coaches. Some highlights include: Boys Basketball team won the Bowling Green Tournament, had four All-State athletes, 31 All-District athletes, 23 All-Conference athletes, 7 Academic All-State athletes and 2 band members were All-Conference.

None of these accomplishments would be possible without the dedication of the athletes and coaches; the support of the Bull-dog Boosters and parents; and the commitment from the Louisiana R-II Board of Education.

Whenever possible, we give the students at LHS opportunities to give back to the community that makes everything possible. LHS has an active chapter of the National Honor Society. This year, as in the past, they provided services to the Pike County Memorial Hospital, the Twin Pike Family Y, the Louisiana Chamber of Commerce, as well as donations and drives on behalf of area non-profits. Our students volunteered with the Department of Conservation at Eagle Days and Duck Days. Our A+ students enroll in a Student Outreach and Community Service class. In that class, they have opportunities to serve as class-room aides and peer tutors in the Louisiana Middle and Elementary Schools. Students on both sides find the class rewarding.

Our music program received some wonderful gifts this year. The Community Foundation of Quincy awarded a \$4,000 grant for new instruments, and the District was able to match that amount! Additionally, the Alumni and Friends Association donated \$3,000 to upgrade the sound system for the annual musical.

Last year LHS began a Trap Shooting team sponsored by our FFA chapter. Participation and interest has been exciting. We were able to secure grants from various organizations to outfit the team and they are active in local and State competitions.

Our Interact Chapter (a high school arm of the Rotary Club), raised funds throughout the year to provide the materials to build a school in Haiti. With outstanding support from the Rotary Club, 5 students and a faculty sponsor travelled to Haiti to assist in the construction. The Interact Club also maintains a community garden on campus and donates hundreds of pounds of fresh produce to local food pantries.

One final note — The Bulldog Boosters have partnered with the District to upgrade the curb appeal of the football complex. They are installing a beautiful black aluminum fence across the entire home side of the complex. In addition, they are building a new ticket booth. Their goal is to have it ready for the first football game of the season. This is a great example of just one more way that the community supports our efforts at LHS.

Our doors are always open to Alumni and Friends. If you are in town, please stop by for a tour of our campus. Depending on how long it has been, you may notice significant changes. All of our facilities are top notch in the area and in the Clarence Cannon Conference. I would enjoy giving anyone interested a tour of the grounds. It is all of your hard work, contributions, and accomplishments that make LHS what it is today.


